He had retired and then signed on with the federal government to be a navigator. He flew a topsecret mission into a third-world country to deliver arms and weapons. I didn't know this when he came to my farm in August 1972. He asked if he could stay for a few weeks, and I later found out this was not a vacation but a disappearance prior to working with the CIA. They were required to deliver arms and flex money, which that, but they said it was a hell of a good time. was a difficult situation. They were flying a commercial 707 with the seats removed to contain weaponry. After


